Profile

The Evangelische Hochschule Nürnberg (EVHN) is a nationally recognised centre of university education for religious education, social education and care-oriented careers in the church, social ministries and the wider society. Education is based on the Christian concept of man. Therefore, aside from the scientific foundation of the lessons, research, further and continuing education, there are additional topics on offer – all types of spiritual, personality-building and general education. In addition to their scientific qualification and training, students are encouraged to reflect on their own person and ethical questions in one's profession and in society.

The manageable size of approximately one thousand students and small study groups allows for a personal cooperation between lecturers and students. As a state-approved university of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Bavaria, the EVHN cooperates with reputable practice institutions and other universities at home and abroad.

■ Faculty of Social Sciences

In accordance with the basic requirements of a Christian concept of man the Faculty of Social Sciences has committed itself to the support of the development of disadvantaged children, youth and adults. This also includes the management of social institutions as well as resource-saving, economic actions. The aim of the faculty is to qualify students for work in interesting and highly dynamic fields of work, which demand specialist knowledge as well as reflected ethical positions and creativity when solving upcoming problems.

■ Faculty of Religious Education, Adult Education and Diakonik (Christian Social Work)

People of all ages explore religious issues, try to understand life and attempt to give it meaning. Religious education and Christian adult education show how people can live their faith. They help to let Christianity become a useful orientation in the lives of children, young people and adults. The break in the tradition of religious practice in many families makes this education sector very significant for the future of the church. The objective of the Faculty of Religious Education, Adult Education and Diakonik (Christian Social Work) is to qualify staff for theological educational tasks within the church.

■ Faculty of Health and Care

Health and care affects everybody, be either ageing or falling ill themselves, or being responsible for elderly and sick people. It is the objective of this faculty to offer qualifications to personnel for this socially sensitive area. This includes a high care qualification and its further development, and also intensive discussion of approaches to reforming education for the modern qualifications for future healthcare workers. The transfer of economical approaches on healthcare is another focus, in order to be able to offer good quality to ill people or those in need of care, at an affordable price. Ethical issues are also included in the lessons and research. The starting point of our work is the term "life" itself: What is the meaning of life especially if one is sick, old or in distress? Which values should the nursing staff have towards people entrusted to their care?

■ Go world wide

For the international basis of our work the motto "go world wide" applies. We encourage students to go abroad for either a practical or an academic semester. Our university cooperates with numerous universities, in Europe and further afield; Projects abroad and study trips enhance the opportunities of intercultural learning.

■ Masters studies and promotion



In the Masters course "Social Management" (M.S.M.) staff from welfare institutions (both public and private) are offered to qualify for managerial and administration functions.

The Masters course "Adult Education" (M.Edu.) qualifies for managerial functions in adult education/further education, for an independent employment e.g. as a lecturer, trainer or for cooperation in educational counselling and human resources development. Both Masters courses were reaccredited in 2010.

The Doctoral studies in Nursing Science in cooperation with the private University for Health Sciences, Medical Informatics and Technology (UMIT) in Hall/Austria provides the qualification for independent scientific work.


■ Research in practice for practice

Two institutes are affiliated to the Evangelische Hochschule Nürnberg.

The Institute for Research and Evaluation in church, social and educational areas is a service pool for church and social organisations, as well as companies and education institutions. It realises practical research and evaluation projects, offers counselling on quality assurance and quality development, moderates self-evaluation processes and accompanies pilot projects in practice.

The Institute for Gerontology and Ethics wishes to contribute to comprehending the problems of the elderly and to develop application-oriented solutions. Particular emphasis is placed on the challenges regarding care for the elderly based on Christian thought.

In addition, lecturers at our university carry out research projects.
