Similarly to Germany, Taiwan has a rapidly aging population. Therefore Taiwan launched the long-term care plan 2.0 (2017-2026), which focuses on person-centered and community-based services. One of the intended aims is to offer a package of care following the ABC scheme: Integrated Community Service (A), Long-term Care Service Institution (B) and long-term care corner store (C). Despite the long-term care policy Taiwanese families still need migrant care workers to cover their demand. An unregulated market has emerged alongside the state system. The talk gives insights into the migrant caregivers working and living in Taiwan. Results of interviews with government social workers, caregivers and NGOs are included in the presentation.

Prof. Dr. Chih-Bang, Assistant Professor at the Asia University Taiwan, PhD in Germany. His teaching and research areas are Community social work, senior community caring and domestic violence.

Protecting refugee and migrant children requires multistakeholder collaboration and working across borders in complex political contexts. The contribution of faith based, and inter-religious communities and organizations can be vital to supporting children whose lives have been affected by forcible displacement or migration. The talk will emphasize the “From Faith to Action” initiative, which focuses on children escaping conflict, persecution, natural disaster, or poverty, and brings together UNICEF and stakeholders from faith-based communities who share the aspiration of providing support and protection: physically, psychologically, and spiritually. He sees diversity as the fundamental issue for conflict prevention, peace and reconciliation. How can we be tolerant and co-exist peacefully, without giving up of our group values and interests? Which initiatives are promoting peace? How do the churches focus on equipping young people with conflict management skills?

Emmanuel Kwame Tettey: Research Fellow at the Akrofi-Christaller Institute of Theology, Mission and Culture in Ghana, Associate at the Centre for Interfaith Studies and Engagement in Africa (CISEA). He studied Economics at the University of Ghana, Masters in Theology and Missions at the Akrofi-Christaller Institute, Masters in Islamic Studies and Christian-Muslim Relations at the University of Edinburgh.
